Dear Parishioners,

The empty tomb is not proof of Jesus' resurrection, but an invitation to faith. The tomb invites us to believe that goodness will ultimately triumph over evil, that Christlike behavior such as patience, nonviolence, compassion, and so on *does* ultimately defeat evil no matter what form evil takes. We can, however, let ourselves be perpetually scandalized by the seeming triumph of evil, pain, and suffering in our world.

God's silence can forever scandalize us: in the Jewish holocaust, in ethnic genocides, in brutal and senseless killing and wars, in the earthquakes and tsunamis which kill thousands of people and devastate whole countries, in how unfair life can be sometimes. Where is God in all of this? What is GOD's answer?


God's answer is the resurrection of Jesus in the perennial resurrection of goodness within life itself. But resurrection is not necessarily rescue. God doesn't rescue us from the effects of evil. or even from death. Evil does what it does, natural disasters are what they are, and selfish people can cause great harm even as they feed off life's sacred fire.

This feast of Easter affirms that GOD's final judgment is RESURRECTION. What the Resurrection is saying, more than anything else, is that love is stronger than death. Jesus walked through both life and death with love, which becomes an infinite life, a participation in GOD.

So to be a Christian is to be inevitably a person of HOPE. GOD, in Christ is saying: "This is what will last --- my life and my love will always & forever have the final word."

May we know Christ present when we break bread with those we love.


Today is the Day of days:

REJOICE AND BE GLAD

During the first three or four centuries of Christianity, if you asked a Christian to name the feast days of the church, your answer would have been a puzzled stare, for there was only one feast: the Resurrection of the Lord. Every Sunday was a feast celebrating the one great feast. Even though our

calendar now has many beautiful and holy feasts, we must continually be called back to the fact that all these other

feasts exist because of the feast of Christ's passover from death to life. The psalm today proclaims this message well: "This is the day." It is not one of many days, but it is the day of all days, the one that gives all the others their origin, purpose, meaning, and destiny. Listen carefully to Peter's

speech in Acts with its recollection of the Passion, to the words of the apostle Paul, and to the account of Mary Magdalene, John, and Peter finding the empty tomb, and you will hear the many wonderful works that God has

PARISH REGISTRATION We always welcome new parishioners to St. Teres of Avila Parish. Please call or visit the Parish Office on weekdays during business hours, to register.

BAPTISM is usually celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month at 12:00PM. Please call the Parish Office at 610-666-5820 for upcoming baptism dates. Parents must attend our Pre-Jordan Class prior to their child's baptism. Due to the COVID pandemic please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

MATRIMONY: Couples must make arrangements for matrimony in person with the parish clergy at least *six* months prior to date of their anticipated wedding ceremony. One of the parties must have family registered in the parish at the time the couple comes to make arrangements. Please call the Parish Office for an appointment with the parish clergy.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Parishioners who are seriously ill, weakened by advanced age, or entering the hospital for surgery are encouraged to request the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Homebound sick <u>and elderly may</u> receive Holy Communion in their homes on a regular basis. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for a home visit or to request an anointing.
